Duo to Present Concert

Lake Wales, FL- Celebrated duo Ann Fontanella and David Pasbrig will appear at the Lake Wales Arts Center on Thursday, March 4 at 7:30 pm, the fifth in a series of performances being offered at the center. Virtuoso violinist Fontanella and acclaimed pianist Pasbrig blend their styles and techniques together in a Bel Canto performance of classical music.

Ann Fontanella, an extraordinary young violinist, has been performing since the age of ten with numerous prestigious awards and critical acclaim. She is a protégé of late Yale University music professor Erick Friedman, who has said of Fontanella, “Very few people in the world play violin as well as she.” Also a recognized composer, Fontanella’s tonal palette ranges from lyrical to electrifying precision.

David Pasbrig is an elegant pianist, acclaimed for his range of tonal qualities and technical finesse. *New York Times* columnist Rene Fruchter called him “a brilliant and versatile artist.” He is in demand as a soloist, chamber musician, and pedagogue.

In addition to the performance by the prestigious duo, Fontanella and Pasbrig will participate in the Lake Wales Art Council’s Educational Outreach Program through offering a master class on March 5. Ticket prices for the performance and reception are \$20 for members, \$30 for non-members, and \$10 for students. Group rates are available for groups of 10 or more. Tickets are on sale at the Lake Wales Arts Center.
